LAUNCH CONTROL CENTER (LCC)

The LCC has been the hub of launch operations at Kennedy Space Center (KSC) since the Apollo Program, and has played an integral role in NASA's human spaceflight programs for nearly 50 years. Its third floor houses four multilevel firing rooms where the final checkout of each launch vehicle built to carry astronauts occurred.

Today, the LCC is undergoing its latest metamorphosis in preparation for the processing and launching of a new generation of rockets and spacecraft. The Agency's Exploration Ground Systems (EGS) Program is coordinating the changes to the firing rooms that will enable the LCC to play a significant, changing role in the operations of future missions for NASA and private companies as new strides are made to explore space.
